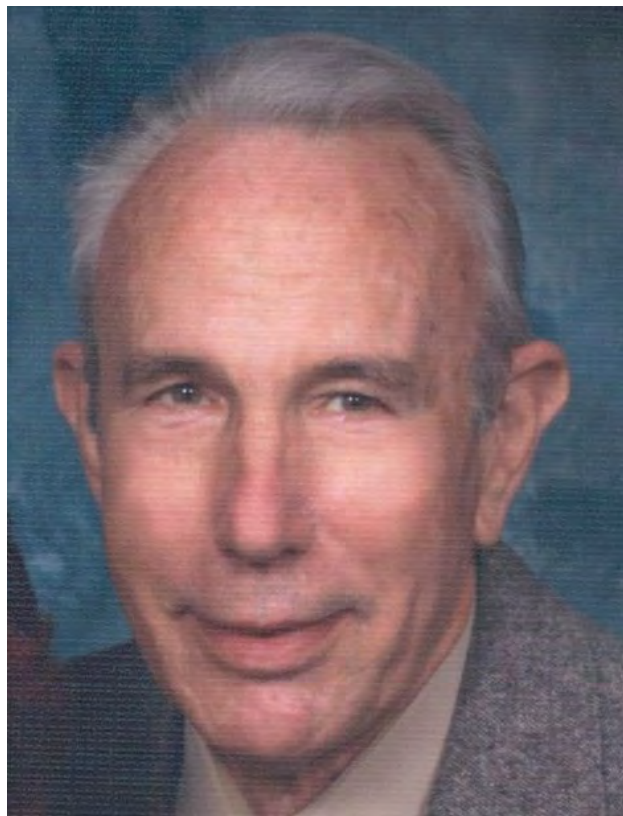

In Memorial:



We regret to announce the passing of Carolina Jaguar Club member Frank Zamaroni. Frank passed away on December 13 at Scotia Village, Laurinburg, where he was living with his beloved wife Joan Guyet Zamaroni. Frank is also survived by his children Catherine Bailey and Robert Zamaroni, as well as 4 grandchildren.

Frank was born June 15, 1938 in Berkeley, CA to parents Frank Ralph Zamaroni, Sr. and Olive May Weymouth Zamaroni. He graduated from Berkeley High School in 1957 and it was during those years that he met his beautiful wife Joan Yvonne Guyot, whom he married in 1960.

Frank was always most proud of his family, but he also loved giving back to his local community. Since moving to North Carolina in 2000, he tutored students at the local community college. He also served on the Whispering Pines council as a council member, during which time he chaired the Water Task Force. He managed his friend Louis Gregory's campaign for Moore County Commissioner, served as Treasurer for the Moore County Republican Men's Club, and was an active member of the Sandhills Rotary Club. After moving to Scotia in Laurinburg he was involved in many activities there.

Frank and Joan joined our club after purchasing a Radiant

Red 1999 XJ8. Frank was an expert detailer and took more than a few trophies showing it. A few years later Frank and Joan acquired a 2004 XJ VDP also in Radiant Red. Then he fell in love with a Jaguar Racing Green 2008 Super V8. Frank loved that Radiant red color so much he eventually traded for a 2009 XK convertible in Radiant Red. He and Joan loved attending meetings and showing their Jaguars all with a special NC license plate that read, "TICKELSME."

In addition to all his other activities and responsibilities listed above, Frank served as President of our club in 2010 and again in 2011. He represented our club at the Annual General Meetings in Indianapolis (2010) and again in Richmond (2011).

In a Feb. 2011 Litter Box Cat Tales article, Frank (as President), commented on memories of his automobile experiences generated by a CJC visit to Bennett Classics Auto Museum in Forest City, NC in January 2011. He stated that his first car was a 1939 Plymouth coupe that he had saved his paper route money to buy. In the same article, he noted that he had had a 1955 Chevy 2-door Bel Air, hard top. He later noted in the same article that he had learned to disc a field on his uncle's farm with a John Deere tractor. He concluded by recalling the time spent at race tracks as his son Bob raced a quarter-midget, beginning at age 6.

From his last Litter Box President's column, December 2011, he stated:

"To the officers and members of the club I say a big 'Thank You' for making these past two years so rewarding. It has been an honor and privilege to serve as your president and I can truly say, 'Thank you for the Memories'. To each and every member of our Club I wish the Best of times as we look forward to the coming year."

His friends will remember the difference between his public laugh and his goofy private snicker, his affection for cars, his skill at all things hand-worked, and his loyalty to those he loved. We can truly say back to Frank, we will miss you and "Thank you for the Memories."

IN THE REARVIEW MIRROR (Part 7)

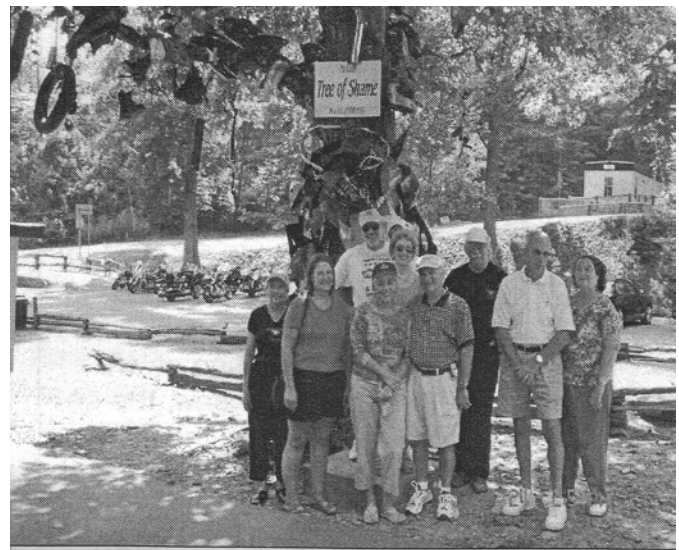
Carolina Jaguar Club Members Tame "The Tail of the Dragon" by Jerry Cohen

"August 24, 2005, Deal's Gap, NC, the day the brave caravan of Jaguars spanning three decades in age and a 1965 Morgan Plus 4 took on "The Tail of the Dragon." It was the second full day of the western North Carolina road trip organized and planned by Jerry and Naoma Ellison... Our "Walkie Talkies" were tuned to channel 16 and while we waited for a sign from Jerry Ellison in his '65 Morgan to lead us out. The day's caravan was comprised of the Ellison's Morgan, Jerry and Judi's XJSC (Ruby), Kenny and Phyllis Watt's XJ6, Frank and Joan Zamaroni's XJ8, and Rick and Georgia Sorenson's S-type. We enjoyed a scenic drive along the Great Smoky Mountain parkway with several stops along the way as we headed for Townsen, TN, where we were to have lunch at Miss Lili's café. After a great lunch, we were on the road again heading for "The Tail." Judi and I had the tops off of Ruby (his XJSC). We never advanced past 3rd gear, but there were plenty of

We crossed Fontana Lake after riding along its shores for a long time, and then



began the climb up the Nantahala Gorge. The train runs mostly just beside and above the river, offering wonderful views of the rapids and rafters drifting downstream. Brand new full harness for Jaguar XK150DHC (dual bulb tail lamp model)

During the restoration of my late 1958/early 1959 XK150DHC, we ordered the wrong harness in error. The error was only discovered during fitting. It turns out that my vehicle was a few numbers short of the one for which the harness is designed. The harness for sale is for a mid-to-late 1959 model with DUAL BULBS in the tail lamps (Oct. 1959 onwards, #838458 onwards).
