

CAT TALES

Ron Kuligowski and I attended the JCNA Annual General Meeting in San Antonio, Texas last month. I enjoyed seeing the now familiar faces within the JCNA organization. My first AGM initiation was in Philadelphia in 2014 when I attended as the Jaguar Journal's new advertising manager – not a



delegate representing Carolina Jaguar Club. The meeting coincided with a late winter/early spring snowstorm. My fondest memory of that trip is Ron and Barbara Kuligowski, Naoma Ellison, Linda Hayden and I walking around Philadelphia in the snowstorm trying to catch a cab. As is often the case, inclement weather makes an event memorable. Here's a question to prove my point: which concours in Little Switzerland comes to mind first? You probably thought of the rain-soaked concours in 2013. No one got deductions for water spots that year.

In my brief AGM experience, this year's meeting was more relaxed and flowed more smoothly through the agenda than previous years' that had topics that generated heated debates. The only topic discussed at any length was the XK120 Concours Guide. The following is from Peter Crespin's AGM summary in the May/June issue of the Jaguar Journal. "This new guide was approved in the main meeting and will be added to the list of JCNA publications after being trialed in 2018 at selected events. Test use will check specifically for any clashes with existing JCNA rules. In addition, its practically will be tested – as if it requires, say, a significant increase in judging time from the current six minutes, this would have potentially serious impact on judge resources or entry numbers. With another XK originality book being published this year, albeit at many times the cost of the JCNA guide, the potential exists for clashes of opinion and formal complaints about concours scores. Meanwhile, the fact that wire wheels would now be permitted meant the meeting agreed that calipers or drums must now be judged for cleanliness, where before it was a nonissue due to disc wheels hiding these components. Whitewalls will not be

REGISTRATION IS NOW OPEN!

We are at T-minus 13.5 weeks from the start of our 2018 CJC HEAD FOR THE MOUNTAINS Concours, being held from July 12 to July 14! Can you believe the mountains received snow this weekend, and we're looking forward to temps between 70-80 degrees in just a short amount of time?

Planning continues, with a few details still in process. Particulars below:

ROOM AVAILABILITY:

Please make sure to call Switzerland Inn soon to reserve your room! They will be opening any remaining rooms up to the public in June.

REGISTRATION IS OPEN!

We have finalized the registration details and form, and it will be sent out in this newsletter, as well as via blast email. We are accepting checks as payment, and as always, payment must be made prior to joining in the fun and/or entering your car for judging. A few notes on the registration:

Costs to the club have increased, so you will notice the increases in the registration.

Your personal registration costs have been the same price for over 5 years. They have been raised to help cover the administrative supplies used for the event.

It was previously understood the meal and the drink costs included taxes and gratuity but we were informed they did not. The Inn has now included taxes and gratuity in the meal and drink ticket costs.

Drink tickets can only be used at the Patio Bar cocktail hour that precedes the Friday and Saturday night dinners. They are good for one beer, one wine or one simple cocktail. You will receive one drink ticket per person with each registration. You may pre-purchase additional drink tickets on your registration for \$7 each (slightly less than our cost from the Inn).

FRIDAY DRIVE EVENT:

We currently have three possibilities:

One idea from Don Koepnick is to visit the Moses Cone Manor which is just outside Blowing Rock. It would make for an easy Friday drive and folks could continue into downtown Blowing Rock, for those who like to shop.

The CONCOURS Itself – Saturday, July 14:

As in past years, the plan is to park the Judged cars on the grass behind the Restaurant, and the Display cars behind the Inn. Our Field Team will begin escorting cars to their appointed positions on Saturday at 08:00am. There will be no parking on the field prior to Saturday 8am. And all cars must be escorted – both Judged and Display.

Our Concours has become very popular to surrounding car clubs and enthusiasts. Because we are dedicated to the safety of our people, the Inn's property, and our vehicles, and based upon our experiences over the past 4 years, we will be limiting the number of Judged vehicles on the grass field to 30 (same as last year), and the Display vehicles on the grass field to 10. 

Our Club's Family Tree

Whew! I've got to catch my breath after climbing from the sub-basement of the club archives to bring this month's article. So you ask how far back we're going? To the mid-nineties again? Au contraire, Pierre! Did you travel with Don McLean as he "drove his Chevy to the levee?" Or with America as they cruised "Ventura Highway in the sunshine?" If so, you may guess we're off to the seventies...

If you remember from my Litter Box article last year about the formation of our club in 1992, Jim Morton was the unofficial club historian and I obtained a lot of his material from Mimi Morton after Jim died. Among the papers was a scrapbook that Jim's notes said he had obtained from long time CJC members Von and Sally Patterson. The scrapbook contained correspondence and photos from the formation of a "Carolina Jaguar Club" in the Summer of 1972.

The correspondence was generated by Frank Butler who was the first president of that club. From information in the scrapbook, I realized the initial members were primarily from the Raleigh/Durham/Chapel Hill area. So I consulted with CJC member and tribal elder Steve Thomas to see what tribal memories he could conjure up. Steve remembered Frank Butler and knew he had recently died, but he put me in contact with Frank's son, Ed Butler, who lives in Apex, NC.

I've visited with Ed (who is restoring an E-Type originally owned by his father) and had a good conversation about his father's love for Jaguars. Frank's passion for Jaguars ran deep; Ed estimates Frank owned thirty or more including a barn-find that came with a snake living in it. The letters in the scrapbook are between Frank Butler and F. S. Horner and document the affiliation of that club with JCNA (see this on the next page). Horner was executive secretary of JCNA from 1970 to 1979. Some of you may recognize his name from the Fred Horner Sportsmanship Award that is presented annually at the Annual General Meeting of JCNA. The affiliation agreement for the "Carolina Jaguar Club" is dated July 17, 1972, and signed by Horner and Butler.

The scrapbook contains some photos and a newspaper article of a club gathering at Duke Forest in August, 1972. The photos accompanying this article are reproductions of black and white prints in the scrapbook. Captions in the newspaper article identify Frank Butler, Hank Thompson (of Thompson Cadillac in Raleigh), Chris Bechard (of Foreign Accents), Tom Hill, Bill Bland, and Robert and Betsy Denny as some of the members at the gathering. Ed provided me his father's partial history of his Jaguar owning experiences and the history says the club continued for a couple more years before dwindling attendance ended it. However, I noted in my Litter Box article last year that the 1992 newsletter documenting the formation of "our" CJC in 1992 said that Sally Patterson came up with the name Carolina Jaguar Club for our club. Since this scrapbook I'm describing was given to Jim Morton by Sally and Von Patterson, I'd like to think the name and spirit of our Carolina Jaguar Club can trace its DNA back to Frank Butler and the other Jaguar lovers that gathered to form that club in the Summer of 1972.


